- (b) Please comment on any items in your table that would make it difficult to understand or believe the results of the survey (e.g. you couldn't get the information, or the information you got worries you in some way). *If you are happy with all the information in your table, just say that.*
- 2. For several years, the American Automobile Association (AAA) has conducted a survey called the Traffic Safety Culture Index. The 2011 report (as well as reports from earlier years) can be found at http://www.aaafoundation.org/reports. Re-do question #1(both parts!) for the AAA Traffic Safety Culture Index survey.
