The following material should be sent as soon as possible thereafter.

- (1) Official transcripts of all college or university work to date.
- (2) A copy from the Educational Testing Service (ETS) of your scores on the aptitude section of the Graduate Record Examination, unless you are a foreign student who has requested a waiver. (You may send a photocopy of your scores along with this application; however, official scores are required.)
- (3) Three letters of recommendation evaluating your potential for graduate study from persons who know you well, including at least two professors. (These should be sent directly to the Department of Statistics.)
- (4) If English was not your native language, a report of the scores you achieved on the Test of English as Foreign Language (TOEFL). (You may send a photocopy of your scores along with this application; however, official scores are required.)
